 - LIP is partnering with the Sault Community Career Centre to host the festival at the Downtown Plaza from 11am to 4pm. Applications for cultural performers have been posted and will close on June 9th.

5. New Business

a) Newcomer mental health action plan

- Gathering data on newcomer and immigrant demographics in Sault Ste. Marie is key
 to understanding who we are serving, what languages they speak, and what barriers
 they are facing. This data will help in narrowing down the group's vision and goals to
 develop the action plan.
 - > IAC can create a survey to collect this data
 - ➤ There is existing data through the City's RNIP program and through the Sault Community Career Centre that LIP can access if needed. The group can also extrapolate data points from Marlene's presentation about newcomers and mental health.
- Storytelling is one of the main ways to showcase our power, resilience, and joy as immigrants; how we continue to survive and thrive as human beings in a different country and context.
 - ➤ IAC can develop a series of talks or presentations about several topics (examples: newcomer mental health; presentation to newcomers about non-profits, navigating language barriers; sharing stories and experiences of this past winter's snowstorm, etc.)
 - Members discussed the idea of building online presence by starting with their own stories, which can be shared through LIP's social media channels and website.
